Last year, pupils at HBN Eco club identified that they wanted to plant some trees to make their school more wildlife friendly and to enrich their learning experience.

Volunteers from the Woodland Trust are going to help some of the pupils with this task by planting a small number of native trees that will attract birds and generally improve our Forest school area. The pupils will then be responsible for watering and general care of the trees.

The trees have been carefully selected to be low growing, provide interest for wildlife and pupils alike and reasonably robust. We have suffered from vandalism in the past, but we are hopeful that with a little care, our trees will thrive and benefit the whole community.
