Writing Practice

'Cause and effect' connectives

'Cause and effect connectives' – like **because** and **so** – link two parts of a sentence together. Adding a cause and effect connective allows you to explain something further or give a reason. Much better!

For example:

1. An octopus can squeeze through tiny cracks. **X**
An octopus can squeeze through tiny cracks **because** it has no bones. **✓**
2. The blue whale came to the surface. **X**
The blue whale came to the surface **so** it could find food. **✓**

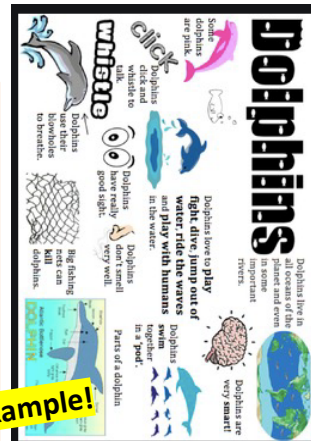
1. Use a 'cause and effect' connective to add more detail to each of these sentences:
