Make a list of all flowers and plants you see around you; on a walk, at the park, or in your own garden.

Make models of all the plants and flowers you find.

*You could use lego/play doh, or natural materials from the garden such as; wood, stones, twigs, grass etc.





This week you will be counting in tens. We hope that by the end of the week you can count in tens by heart, forwards and backwards (starting from any number) to 50 or 100.



Can you complete these challenges?

Ways to practise:

- Write the tens on post it notes (10, 20, 30 etc) and hide them around the room/ house. Send your child to find them.
 When they return, give them challenges to order them forwards and backwards starting from different numbers.
- Throw a ball to each other, say a number and each time you catch the ball you need to add 10 on each time. This can be 10, 20 30 or 3, 13, 23 etc.
- Count using 10 pence pieces. Ask questions such as; 'If this chocolate bar costs 40p, how many 10 pence pieces will I need'?
- Draw a tens hopscotch on the ground and practise counting forwards and backwards each time you jump.
- Count how many toes are in your household.
- Count how many fingers are in your house.
- Make a 'Counting in 10's' poster to teach your friends at school.

Mental Maths Starters:

Number Splat Make number cards / draw numbers on paper or a whiteboard. Splat a number bigger than 2. Splat a number smaller than 20. Splat a number equal to 19 etc.

9 box Bingo

Draw a 9 box bingo card on a whiteboard / paper / in book. Two lines down, two lines across. 9 numbers from 0-20/30/50. I am thinking of a number 1 more than 14, 1 less than 8, 2 groups of 10, 2 more than etc.
