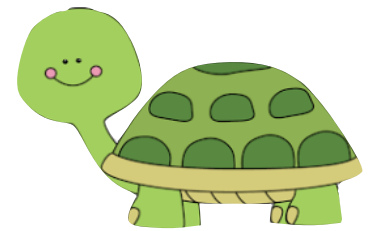




Home Learning - Week 4

Make a beanstalk with 26 leaves and write the alphabet on it.

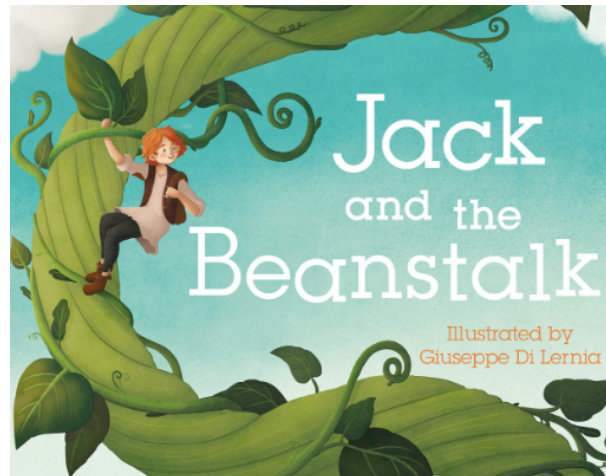
If you could have any land at the top of the beanstalk, what would it be and what would you do there?

Write a list of words to describe each character eg, cross.



What do you think it would be like to be a giant for the day? What would you do?

Re-write the story but change part of it - eg, a different plant, a different animal.

Write a letter to the giant from Jack or Jack's mum?

Imagine a giant came to Douglas. Write what happened the day he came to town.

Draw a map of the Giants castle.

Design or make your own golden egg.

Write a list of all the characters.

Adding equal groups

Count in equal groups of 2, 5 and 10 to find a total.
For example, there are 4 bunches of 5 balloons so
therefore $5+5+5+5$

There are bunches of balloons.



How many balloons altogether?

$$\square + \square + \square + \square = \square$$

What if there was 1 more bunch?

There are pairs of socks.



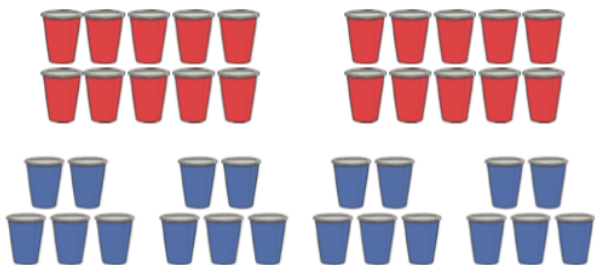
How many socks altogether?

$$2 + 2 + 2 = \square$$

What if there was 1 more pair?

True or false?

2 groups of 10 cups is more than 4 groups of 5 cups.



Quick maths games

- Number splat - write a range of numbers from 1-50 on small different pieces of paper. Using a spatula or a spoon, adult to call out the number and first person to splat it when they find it is the winner!
- Can you make your own number line using stones, post-it notes etc?

Vocabulary for adults

Mathematical Talk

How many apples are there in each bag?
Do all of the bags have an equal number of apples?
How many equal groups can you see?

How can we represent this with counters/cubes/on a number line/in a number sentence etc?

What other equipment could you use to represent your pattern? What's the same? What's different?

Which is more, 3 groups of 10 or 4 groups of 5? Prove why.

Challenges

- Can you draw and work out the answer for $4+4+4+4 = ?$
- How many ways could I put 24 into equal groups? eg, $8+8+8$

Adding equal groups

Can you work out the below questions? You can draw them out if you need to!

7a. Susie has six jars and she puts five sweets in each jar.



How many sweets does she have altogether? Show your working.

7b. Ellie has three train carriages and she puts ten blocks in each.



How many blocks does she have altogether? Show your working.

How many fingers altogether?



$$5 + 5 + 5 =$$



Butterfly Feeding table

Can you make a feeding table for the butterflies like the one below? You can use anything in your house if you don't have any wood.



Grow a carrot top

Can you cut the top off a carrot and then place it onto a plate and watch it grow! Mrs Russell-Dunn is also doing this so lets see who's gets the tallest!



Test the adult!

You're going to have to trust your child for this one!

Can you lay out some plates and on it squirt some smelly things such as vinegar, lemon, coffee, toothpaste etc. Blindfold your adult and then ask them to tell you what they think is on each plate.

You need to write your results down and then see how good their sense of smell is!
