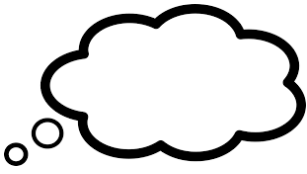


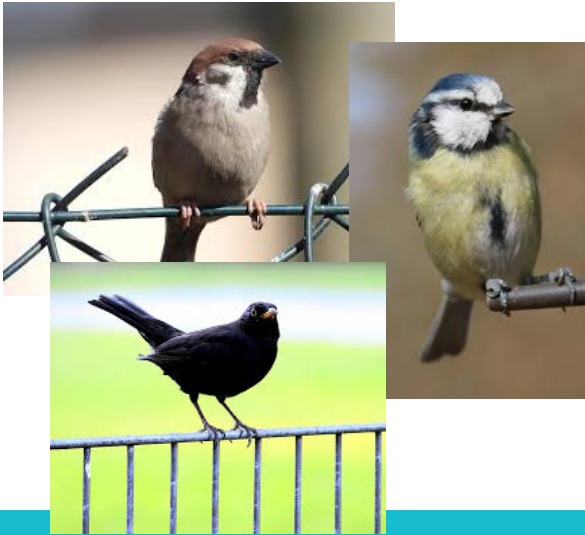
Year 2 Geography home learning.

Birdlife on The Isle of Man

This learning helps me to:



- I am learning to identify birds that are suited to living in cities and coastal areas in the Isle of Man.



Spend a few minutes looking out your window/ in your garden.

Using the bird identification chart, tick off any birds that you can see. Why not try again at a different time of day, or in different weather. Look at closely as you can at **one** of the birds. Think about its features eg beak size and shape, colour of the plumage, where you spotted it, what was it doing. Draw and label a detailed picture of it, or take a photo.

Take a walk on a beach/ along the coast.

Using your Seabird spotter tick off any birds that you see. Try again on a different day, or on a different beach and tick off all the birds you can spot. Again, choose **one** of the birds. Think about its features eg beak size and shape, colour of the plumage, what was it doing. Draw and label a detailed picture of it, or take a photo.

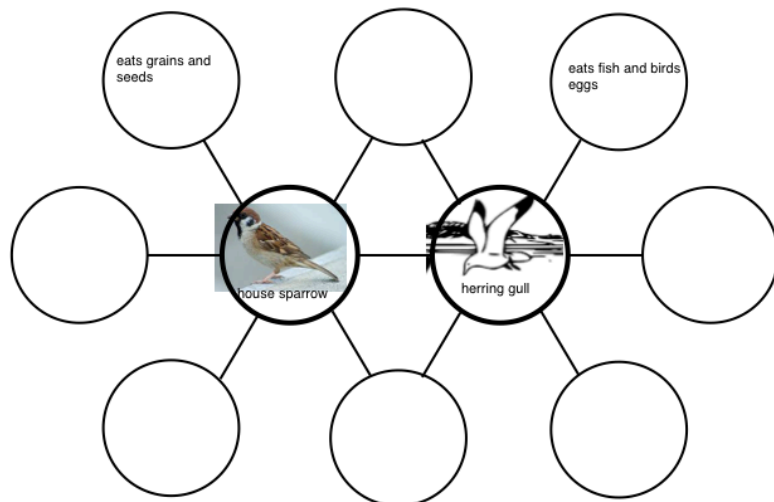
