



How many different ways can you describe the position of the 2p coin?










Starter: Number Hangman
Miss out some numbers in a sequence. Ask your child to complete the sequence. 1, __, 3, 4, __, 6, 7, __, 9, 10


Language and Questions:

- The shape up from the right circle is green.
- The shape down from the circle is green.
- The square to the left of the green triangle is red.






Create a butterfly mask.
